Proudly belonging to one of the largest educational and cultural NGO networks in the world

Alliance Française Dublin – heir to the Cercle français (1907) and the French Society of Dublin (1922), officially labelled in 1960 and established at 1 Kildare Street since 1974. Since 2023, it has strengthened its position in the global rankings, now placing 19th out of 829 Alliances Françaises worldwide. Alongside Paris, it is the only European Alliance Française in the global top 20 and, for the first time in its history, has achieved 2nd place in Europe.

With over a century of history, we are dedicated to promoting French language and culture while fostering intercultural exchange between Ireland and the Francophone world. Our centre is home to a French language, exams centre, library and cultural centre providing a unique space for learning, discovery, and connection.

As a non-religious, non-political, and not-for-profit organisation (CRO 121022; Irish Charity CHY7554), Alliance Française Dublin operates independently as "Alliance Française CLG." Governed by a Board of Directors and guided by its Memorandum and Articles of Association, we maintain 99.5% of our funding independently, ensuring that our mission and growth align with our values and the needs of our community.

Founded in Paris in 1883 by visionaries such as diplomat Paul Cambon, geographer Pierre Foncin, scientist Louis Pasteur, Jules Verne, Ernest Renan... the first Alliance Française was established to promote French culture and language worldwide. Alliances Françaises Fondation in Paris oversees the world largest cultural network with more than 830 locations in 135 countries.

Ireland has a strong connection with France, as French remains the most widely taught foreign language in the country—95% of secondary schools offer it, and 50% of students taking a foreign language for the Leaving Certificate choose French. As Ireland's closest EU neighbour, France continues to develop strong cultural and economic ties with Ireland.

Ireland is home to 5 Alliances Françaises, located in Dublin, Cork, Kilkenny, Limerick, Waterford-Wexford. The Director of Alliance Dublin is leading the Coordination des Alliances Françaises in Ireland, supporting and uniting all Alliances in their shared mission of promoting French language and culture across the country.

Nearly 1 in 1,000 Irish people attended one of the Alliances Françaises in 2024. Alliance Française Dublin represents 90% of the course and cultural activity within the Alliance Française Network in Ireland.



A Rich History – A Common Heritage



- 1859 Construction of the building on a design by Benjamin Woodward
- 1861 The Kildare Street Club, a gentlemen's club created in 1782, moves in
- 1883 Creation of the Alliance Française in Paris
 - 1907 The "Cercle Français de Dublin" is formed
- 1922 First shot fired in the Irish Civil War, accidentally, on one of the building pillars.
 - The Cercle becomes the "Dublin French Society" and already offers tuition
- 1954 The Kildare Street Club divides the building and parts are sold
- 1960 The French Society becomes officially "Alliance Française Dublin" in Herbert Street
- 1971 Significant changes to the interior of the Kildare Street building, with additional floors
- 1974 Alliance Française Dublin moves into the Kildare Street building
 - Inauguration on 15th November by the then French Prime Minister Jacques Chirac
- 1987 The French Ministry of Foreign Affairs purchases the building for the Alliance Française Dublin.
- 2003 Innovative laser treatment restoration of the exterior walls & carvings by Paul Arnold Architects.
- 2006 Extensive interior renovation and refurbishment works on all four floors.
- 2016 Opening of The French Library, a digital and multiform space, unique in Ireland at the time.
- 2023 Alliance Française Dublin ranked 2nd in Europe for the 1st time in its history
- 2024 Landmark Celebration of 50 years at 1 Kildare street on October 12th

Our team consists of around 30 experienced, native French-speaking teachers, all fully qualified in teaching French as a foreign language and continuously trained to ensure high-quality instruction.


e) Recognizing our community: Amis de l'Alliance & Members

An expanded audience strategy will further democratize access to culture while maintaining excellence.

To sustain and enrich our cultural offerings, we are transitioning from a fully free model to a more balanced approach, ensuring long-term viability while preserving inclusivity.

Bridging Education and Culture

By integrating cultural elements into our educational programs, we create immersive learning experiences that break down barriers between disciplines.

Through these strategic shifts, we reaffirm our commitment to culture as a driving force for knowledge, creativity, and engagement.

At the heart of our program are our 3 major Festivals:

Week-end francophone (each March)

Le Festival du film francophone brings free premiere screenings of unsung films selected by participating Embassies from member countries of the Francophonie represented in Ireland.

Franco-Irish Literature Festival (each Spring)

Founded in 2000, it brings together international authors and promotes 3 languages French, Irish and English. The 2024 edition explored the theme of "Taste," featuring roundtables, readings, interviews, film screening and performances, highlighting linguistic and cultural diversity, with guests from Québec, Morocco, Switzerland, Ireland, and France.

Comic Book Festival (each May)

Celebrating both French and Irish comic strip traditions, the festival features live readings, workshops, story-telling, book signings, discussions, exhibitions, screening and a Zine and Comics fair.

A Cultural Hub

The Alliance Française Dublin's Library offers a wealth of resources, including books, films, music, and magazines in French. It's an ideal space for those learning French or anyone passionate about French culture. *Amis de l'Alliance* also gain access to *Culturethèque*, a digital portal with over 130,000 online titles.

Our Library hosts a variety of social and cultural activities:

- French Corner (last Tuesday and Thursday of each month): A friendly and informal conversation workshop to practice French, improve communication skills, and meet new people.
 - Cinéclub: A monthly subtitled screening of must-see French films.
 - Board Game Evening: Open to all, regardless of French proficiency, for a fun night of games and socializing.
 - Matinées: Monthly informal, walk-in screenings of family films.
 - Les Ateliers du Samedi: Storytelling and arts & craft sessions for children, focusing on classic fairy tales.
 - Reading Aloud: A space for participants to read and discuss selected texts.

3. Annual Accounts

Summary

For the financial year from September 2023 to August 2024, Alliance Française Dublin achieved its highest-ever turnover of €1.7M, with a positive net result of €100K.

Alliance Française Dublin is independent and 99.5% self-funded.

This success was driven by the restructuring of our core business – mainly our language courses, making them more diverse, appealing and profitable, along with strict expense control.

Remarkable results

Total Income: +35% between 20-21 (1.3M€) and 23-24 (1.7M€)

Including TWSS covid: +137k€ in 20-21 and Insurance refund +176k€ in 22-23

Short-Term Goals

Alliance Française Dublin strategy and offer are aligned with Irish Government major roadmap:

• Irish teachers' upskilling - 'Say Yes to languages'

Foreign languages will become mandatory in Irish primary schools from September 2025. The pilot project, running since 2021, shows that French is chosen by 30% of participants. The Alliances Françaises will both provide continuous training for primary school teachers and directly intervene in schools that lack the resources to teach French.

• Training for Irish Civil Servants ahead of Ireland's European Presidency

Ireland is an observer member of the OIF and will hold the Presidency of the EU Council in 2026. Alliances Française Dublin is being called upon to train civil servants in French.
